Headteacher's Letter

As we approach the last few days of the term, it is with great pride that I reflect on what has been a highly successful and productive first term.

The children continue to be an absolute credit to you all. In and out of class, their behaviour has been exemplary. There have been over 4000 achievement points, 22 Headteacher Awards and four rewards breakfasts awarded in recognition of their hard work, enthusiasm and kindness to one another this term.

We are also very proud of the high standard of uniform across the school. The children look very smart and continue to wear our uniform with pride. Thank you for your continued support on this matter and we will continue to accept nothing but the highest of standards in this regard.

Academically, we continue to set the standard. The Department for Education recently released their performance data for 2024 and we are delighted to see our school achieve a Progress 8 score +0.75. This score ranks us as the highest performing school in the Archdiocese, third highest amongst all schools and colleges in Lancashire and 35th of all Catholic schools in the country. Such success reflects not only the academic progress that our pupils make but also the nurturing environment and the ethos of excellence that our school embodies. It further demonstrates our staff's ability to inspire, challenge, and support our children in achieving their full potential – a mission that lies at the heart of Catholic education.

Our Year 11 pupils have recently completed their GCSE mock examinations and I am pleased with the mature approach they have taken toward these assessments. Class teachers are now marking their papers and on our return after Christmas, teachers will begin to focus on areas requiring further focus and improvement. If your child is in Year 11, I would like to remind you of our extensive after school revision sessions and recommend that all pupils in the year group attend as many sessions as possible.

Outside of the classroom, there have been many extra-curricular opportunities for our pupils this term. Pupils across different year groups have visited many places including museums, colleges, universities, WW1 Battlefields, Christmas Markets in France and more recently Liverpool Empire Theatre to watch Aladdin. On the sporting front, it is excellent to see such high participation rates. We have achieved lots of success across the year groups.



The cast of We Will Rock You are busy rehearsing in readiness for hitting the stage early next year. It is exciting that we have a production to look forward to and Mrs Chapman-Dean, Mrs Harrison, Mrs Mitchell and the cast are working really hard to put on a great show for us all.

During the season of advent, the church encourages us to prepare for the birth of Jesus through charitable giving. This advent our school community has donated over £4000 worth of toys to various children's charities. We have also donated hundreds of pounds worth of non-perishable food items to our local food bank. The selflessness and generosity of our pupils, who have worked hard to raise money through charitable events, has been a pleasure to see.

Our school choir has also performed at local care homes in Chorley and our reading intervention pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 recently took their favourite books to read to the residents at Astley View Care Home. Such simple acts of kindness bring so much joy to the residents at this festive time and it has been very well received. Our pupils' pride and sense of service towards our community has never been so strong.

Our carol concert was a great success as were our annual Christmas dinners, where we were joined by Fr Mark, Fr Ball, Fr Graeme and Fr Peter. We will bring the term to a close with our Christmas service at St Gregory's church, where as a community we reflect on a very successful term, and look forward to another exciting and busy one when we return in January.

Sir Lindsay will welcome 30 pupils, led by Leadership Co-ordinator Miss Duxbury, for a tour around Westminster in the new year.

The highlight of the trip was the visit to Arras Christmas Market where the children practised their language skills whilst experiencing some French culinary delights such as gaufres (waffles), crêpes (pancakes) and pain d'épices (gingerbread).



The pupils also enjoyed shopping for souvenirs and marvelled at the view from the Ferris Wheel.

At our beautiful hotel, we enjoyed hearty meals with a French flavour - boeuf bourguignon, bûche de Noël, croissants, fromage and of course, ESCARGOTS!

The pupils must be congratulated on their behaviour and engagement with the activities - they have all returned home with an improved understanding of French culture and language.

Enrichment - Year 9 WW1 Battlefields Tour



In October 2024, 90 Year 9 pupils and nine teachers set off from school on our annual pilgrimage to visit the battlefields, memorial and cemeteries of the First World War. We spent two days in Ypres, Belgium and visited Tyne Cot, Langemarck, Essex Farm, Vancouver Corner and the two best Great War Museums in the Ypres Salient.

The pupils also got to explore some of the only preserved original trenches of World War 1 and participated in the world famous Last Post ceremony at the Menin Gate. The final two days of the tour explored the haunting and desolate battlefields of the Somme. Many of the original battlefields lie in land that has been left relatively untouched since 1918 and have an atmosphere that is profoundly moving. This is history in its most raw and bloody state.

Pupils visited Thiepval, Newfoundland Park, the Lochnagar Crater and the Somme Museum in Albert. Perhaps the most emotional experience was standing in the Chorley Pals trench at Serre. We remembered at that moment the dreadful carnage that awaited the men who went over the top at 7.30 am on 1 July 1916. Several pupils laid wreaths at the graves of relatives and tears were shed in remembrance, pride and sorrow. The tour finished with a meal at a French pub and a visit to the beautiful Canadian memorials and battlefields of Vimy Ridge.



The pupils were a credit to the school. An example was in a restaurant in Ypres when they cleared the dishes for the waiting staff of 101 people. The thankful and rather emotional restaurant owner told me that he had never seen a school group do that before.

Year 9 Jackson has been playing snooker since he was six at the Elite Snooker Club in Lostock Hall.


